




# 1.1 Age profile of active participants with an approved plan (no. of






### 1.5 Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) status of active participants with an approved plan



# 2.1 Number of active participants by month of plan approval










# 3.3 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by age group (%)






# 5.1 Active providers as at 30 September 2019 by entity type




# 3.2 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (%)




3.4 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with a function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)








### 6.5 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 0 - 6 yrs








### 6.13 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 7 to 14 yrs




### 6.21 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 15 to 24 yrs




### 6.27 Family/carers of participants age 25+ (selected indicators)






