What is Specialist Disability Accommodation?



Specialist Disability Accommodation (SDA) is housing for people with disability who need:

- a lot of support
- support every day.



Participants might get funding for SDA.

Funding is money in your plan that pays for the support and services you need.



SDA funding is to help participants pay for a place to live that meets their needs.



SDA can support participants so they:

- need less 1-on-1 support
- get support that focuses on what they need.



There are rules about which participants can get SDA funding.

Most participants who meet these rules need a lot of support in their day-to-day lives.

What are we reviewing?



When we **review** something, we check to see what:

- works well
- needs to change.



We are reviewing SDA pricing.

This includes how we work out how much it costs to build a new SDA building.



We are not reviewing the rules about who can get SDA funding.



We wrote a consultation paper that explains what we want to review.



There are lots of complex ideas in our consultation paper.

This includes the maths we use to work out how much SDA should cost.

Who can share their ideas?



We are expecting to hear from businesses that:

- provide SDA housing to participants
- build SDA buildings.



But anyone can share their ideas.

This includes:



participants



disability organisations



 groups that speak up for people with disability.

This also includes:



• government organisations



• academics and experts



• businesses like banks and builders.
