
1.3 The level of function of active participants with an approved plan





2.1 Number of active participants by month of plan approval









3.1 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by support category (%)








4. Average annualised committed supports - most recent approved plans





















6.16 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by support category for age 7 to 14 yrs






6.19 Family/carers of participants 15 to 24


6.21 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 15 to 24 yrs








6.22 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary disability for age 15 to 24 yrs








6.29 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 25+ yrs


