Our co-design workshops



Co-design is when people work together to plan something new.



In September 2021 the NDIA had 2 co-design workshops.



The goal for these workshops was to build:

- strong relationships
- trust.

We also wanted to find ways to:



fix problems



make the National Disability Insurance
 Scheme (NDIS) work better.



The NDIS supports people with disability across Australia.



We held our workshops online.



People from many organisations took part in our workshops.

This included:



• 27 disability and carer organisations



• the Independent Advisory Council



 the Australian Government Department of Social Services



NDIA leaders and managers.



The Independent Advisory Council is a group of people who help us understand what people with disability need.



The Independent Advisory Council has an important job.



The NDIS laws talk about the work the Independent Advisory Council must do.

What did we talk about?

In the workshops, we talked about:



• some problems we know about



 how to build a strong relationship with the disability community.

We also talked about how:



• co-design should work



• we could learn from what went wrong in the past.

What did we decide?



We decided a few things at our workshops.



We must build a better relationship with the disability community.



We must listen:

- when the disability community speaks up
- to what the disability community tells us.



We must all work hard to get better results for people with disability.

It's important to understand:



• all the problems people with disability face



• how we can fix those problems.



We must think about how the problems the NDIS faces can affect different people.



We should work out which problems co-design could help us fix.



Then we should choose which ones to fix with co-design first.

We must communicate well with:



• people with disability



• their families and carers



• the disability sector.

What will we do next?



We will choose people to be part of a co-design advisory group.

The co-design advisory group will work with us to tell us what:



works well



• needs to work better.



We will work out which problems co-design could help us fix.



Then we will choose which problems to fix with co-design first.

We will plan how we will communicate with the disability community about:



• co-design



• other topics we want them to tell us about.
