
2.1 Age profile of active participants with an approved plan (no. of participants)






4.1 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by support category (%)




4.3 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by age group (%)



5. Average annualised committed support - most recent approved plans




5.3 Average annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by age group (\$)




4.2 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (%)




4.4 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)













7.19 Family/carers of participants 15 to 24 (selected indicators)




7.21 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 15 to 24 yrs

7.23 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by annualised committed support band for age 15 to 24 yrs










