






4.1 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by support category (%)




4.3 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by age group (%)




4.2 Total annualised committed support for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (%)





4.4 Total annualised committed support for active participants with a function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)


7.5 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 7 to 14




7.6 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary disability for age 7 to $$14\ yrs$$



7.7 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by annualised committed support band for age 7 to 14 yrs





7.14 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary disability for age 15 to 24 yrs








