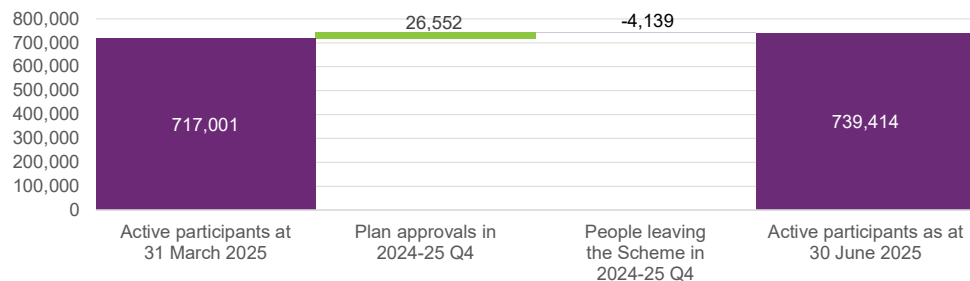

Performance summary:

- 813,010 participants (excluding children accessing early connections) have had an approved plan since July 2013. 739,414 of these continue to be active.
- 525,110 active participants have not previously received disability support via State and Commonwealth government programs in the past.
- 26,552 participants have entered the Scheme in the June 2025 quarter and net participants leaving the Scheme are 4,139, reflecting active participant movements in and out of the Scheme.
- 54,425 plans have had reassessments this quarter.
- 33,700 access decisions have been made in the quarter, of which 26,446 met access and are still active.
- 2,717 (10.2%) of the new active participants this quarter identified as First Nations participants, taking the total number of First Nations participants nationally to 60,529 (8.2%).
- 2,044 (7.7%) of the new active participants this quarter are Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) <sup>5</sup>, taking the total number of CALD participants nationally to 64,697 (8.7%).

<sup>2</sup> From the September 2024 quarter, the number of children accessing early connections is being reported as a 'throughout the quarter' figure rather than an 'end of quarter' figure to better reflect the number of children supported by the Early Childhood Approach.

<sup>3</sup> Trial participants (participants with initial plans approved prior to 1 July 2016) and those with initial plans approved after the end of 2024-25 Q2 have been excluded.

<sup>4</sup> From the December 2024 quarter, Plan Reassessments uses all reassessments including those from plans less than 31 days in duration (previously excluded). Logic for PACE plan reassessments is still being refined, hence the previous quarter's figures are subject to change.

<sup>5</sup> The number of CALD participants excludes First Nations participants.

<sup>6</sup> This section compares baseline indicator results when participants entered the NDIS, with results measured at the most recent participant plan reassessment or check-in for each respondent. Trial participants are excluded.

• The PSG metrics are based on the recommendations of the 2019 Tune Review. The NDIA commenced measuring performance against the PSG metrics prior to the legislation of the Participant Service Charter and Guarantee. On 30 March 2022, the NDIS Amendment (Participant Service Guarantee and Other Measures) Bill 2021 passed in both houses of Parliament, and received Royal Assent on 1 April 2022. It introduces changes that provide greater flexibility for participants and the NDIA to amend plans.

<sup>1</sup> From the March 2024 quarter, performance is being measured using the available data on processes and dates. Milestones are being built into the new computer system to improve the capture of performance data. Where the performance remains unavailable for this quarter, "n/a" has been substituted.

<sup>2</sup> ECA stands for early childhood approach.

<sup>3</sup> From the September 2024 quarter, the PSG timeframe (Service Agreement) to approve a plan for ECA participants after an access decision has been made was altered to 56 days (previously 90 days).

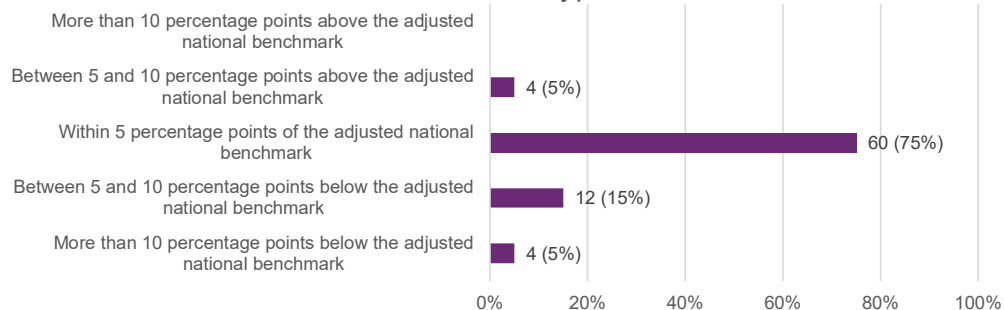

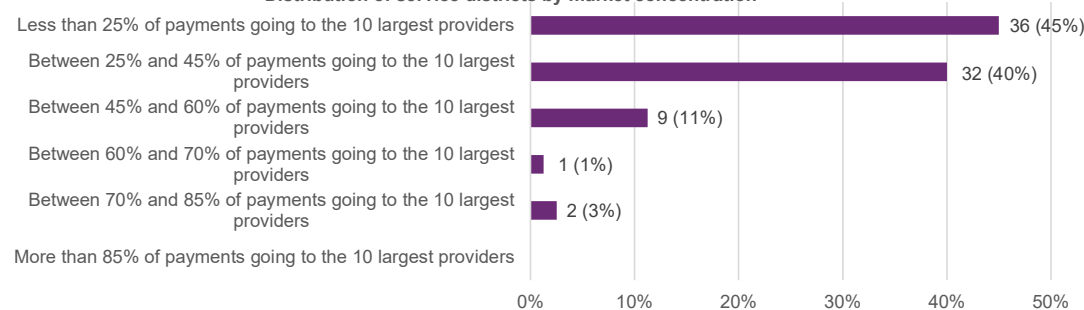

- Total annualised plan budgets at 30 June 2025 were \$61,019m and payments from 1 July 2024 were \$45,853m.
- Out of 269,432 active providers in the June 2025 quarter, 9,751 providers provided support to NDIA-managed participants, 196,237 providers provided support to Funds-managed participants and 135,570 providers provided support to self-managed participants.<sup>1</sup>
- Utilisation has been 75% from 1 October 2024 to 31 March 2025, with 5% (4 out of 80) of service districts more than 10 percentage points below the adjusted national benchmark.
- In 3% (2 out of 80) of service districts, the top 10 providers provide more than 70% of payments.

**Service districts more than 10% below plan utilisation benchmark:**

- NT East Arnhem: 52% vs 71% benchmark
- NT Darwin Remote: 56% vs 69% benchmark
- SA Far North (SA): 62% vs 74% benchmark
- WA Wheat Belt: 59% vs 70% benchmark

**Service districts above the market concentration benchmark:**

- NT Barkly: 78% vs 70% benchmark
- NT Katherine: 71% vs 70% benchmark

<sup>1</sup> From the March 2024 quarter, the active provider number includes both registered and unregistered providers. A participant may have a combination of funds management types over time. From the December 2024 quarter, all providers were required to supply their ABN's to ensure inclusion in this metric (particularly for self-managed participants).

<sup>2</sup> The 'benchmark' in this analysis is the national average after adjusting for the proportion of participants in Supported Independent Living (SIL) in each service district and the length of time participants have been in the Scheme.

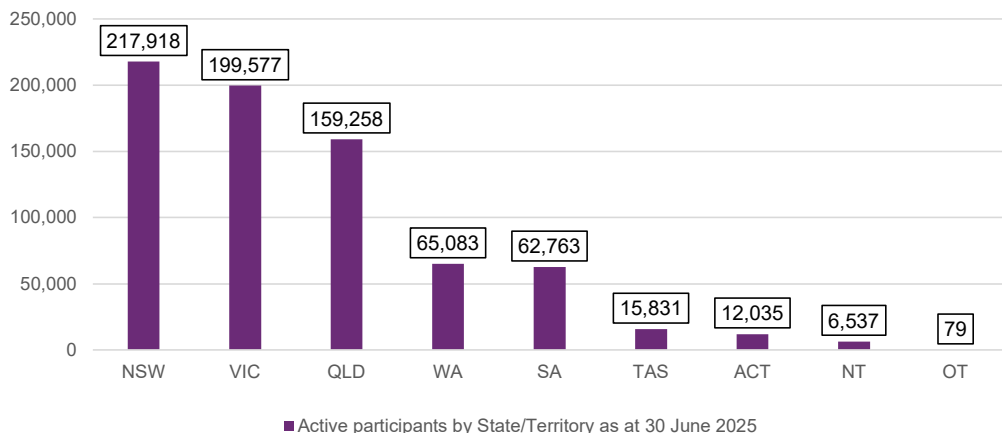
<sup>3</sup> The payment enquiries come from the Provider Portal, Participant Portal and NDIS App. From Nov-24, the Agreed Timeframe measure for payments was updated to be 3-days in line with Performance Measure 2.2 within the Corporate Plan for 2024-25. This was previously 5 days.

<sup>4</sup> Total annualised plan budgets refer to those in the current plans of active participants at the end of quarter.

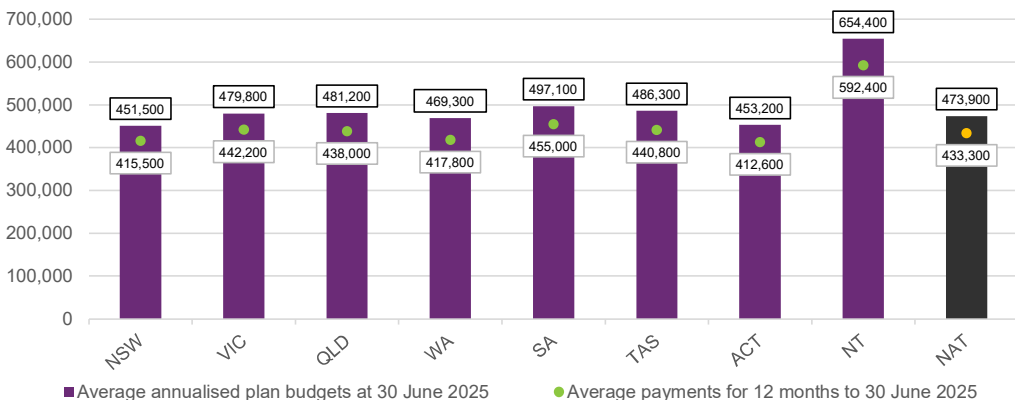
<sup>5</sup> Total plan inflation consists of plan budget changes occurring at plan reassessment as well as changes occurring within a plan between reassessments.

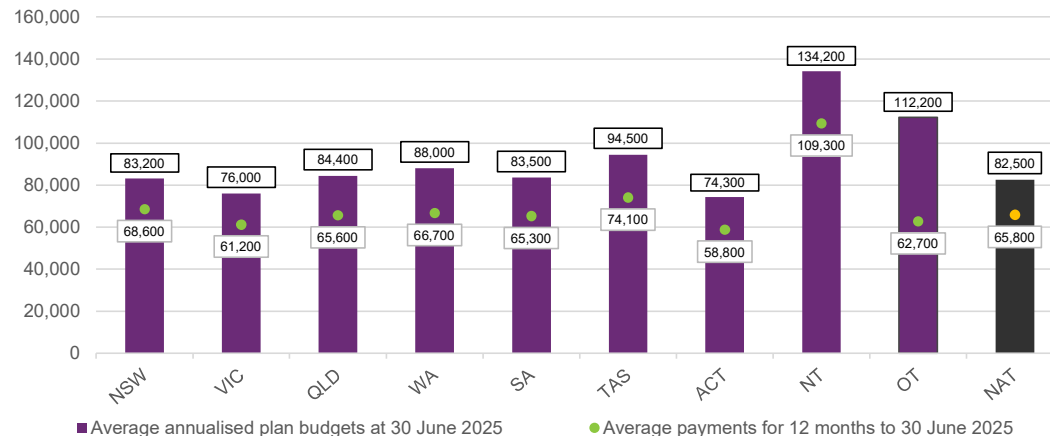
Active participants by State/Territory <sup>1</sup>



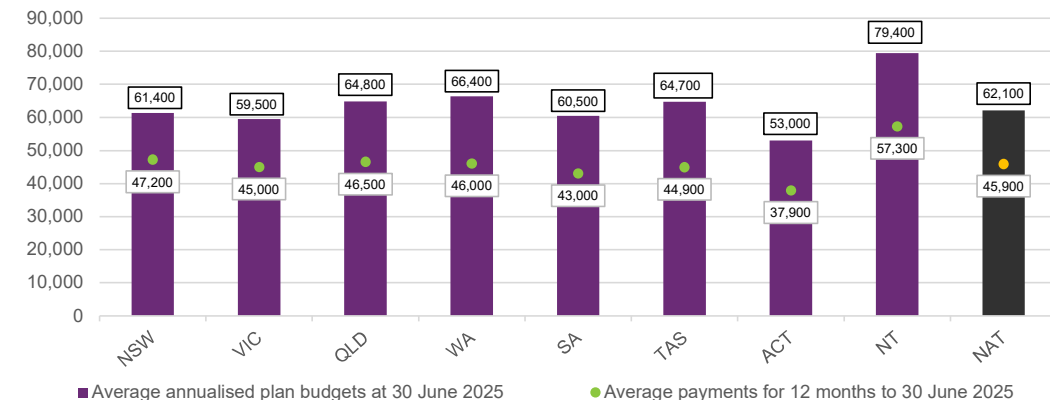
Average annualised plan budgets and average payments - Participants in Supported Independent Living (SIL) (\$) <sup>2 3</sup>

- NSW has the highest number (217,918) of active participants.
- The average annualised plan budget at the end of June for active participants is \$82,500 (\$62,100 for participants not in SIL and \$473,900 for participants in SIL).
- The average payments for the 12 months ending 30 June 2025 are \$65,800 (\$45,900 for participants not in SIL and \$433,300 for participants in SIL).
- NT has the highest average annualised plan budgets and payments. This is partially driven by a higher proportion of participants in SIL compared to other States/Territories.

Average payments are calculated as the average of the annualised monthly payments in the same 12 month period, weighted by the participants that are active in each month.
